NOTE 1.2 - Notes to the Financial Statements and significant accounting policies for the year ended '31s March, 2022 INDIA DENIM LIMITED Notes forming part of the financial statements Particulars 1 Corporate information India Denim Ltd is a public company (Shares not listed) demictled in India and incorporated under the provisions the Companies Act, 1956. The Company was engaged in the manufacturing of collon yern & Trading of Pabrics. The company had not in operation since last 4 years, due to banking and financiaal issues. The company calered to both domestic & international markets. The company is having its registered office located at Village Walthers. Dholks - Bagodars Highway, Tal, Dholks Dist. Ahmedabad. The company has installed spinning unit with installed capacity of 17136 spindles (Ring Spinning) and 576 Rotors (Open and Spinning) at plant 2 Significant accounting policies : 2.01 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS) For all periods up to year ended 31st March, 2017, the Company prepared its financial statements in accordance with accounting standards notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act 2013, read together with paragraph 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014 (Indian GAAP). These financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2021 has prepared in accordance with Ind AS The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for certain financial assets and liabilities, which are measured at fair value / amortised cost. The financial statements are presented in Indian Rupses (), which is the Company's functional and presentation currency and all values are rounded to 'the nearest crore with two decimal, except when otherwise indicated. 2 02 Use of estimates The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the accompanying disclosures, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities. Uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets or liabilities affected in future periods. The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the reporting date, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year. The Company based on its assumptions and estimates on parameters available when the financial statements were prepared. However, existing circumstances and assumptions about future developments may change due to market changes or circumstances arising that are beyond the control of the Company. Such changes are reflected in the assumptions when they occur. 203 Property, Plant and Equipment: Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost of acquisition or construction, net of Cenvat/Value added tax less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Cost includes purchase price, borrowing cost and any cost directly attributable to the bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use. Depreciation on the property, plant and equipment is provided using straight line method over the useful life of assets as specified in schedule II to the Companies Act. 2013. Depreciation on property, plant and equipment which are added during the year, is provided on pro-rata basis succeeding to the month of addition. 2.04 Inventories Inventories are valued as under - At Net Realisable Value 1) Raw Material - At Net Realisable Value 2) Process stock - At Net Realisable Value 3) Finished Goods - At Net Realisable Value 4) Waste 5) Stores Consumable & Spares - At Net Realisable Value The net realisable value derived after providing for obsoloscence and other losses, where considered necessary. Cost includes all charges in bringing the goods to the point of sale, including octrol and other levies, transit insurance and receiving charges. Work-in-progress and finished goods include appropriate proportion of overheads and, where applicable, excise duty. 2.05 Cash and cash equivalents (for purposes of Cash Flow Statement) Cash comprises cash on hand and deposits with banks in the terms of Margin Money. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary flows and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information

2.07 Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation has been provided on the straight-line method as per Schedule II of Company act 2013 on the basis of systematic allocation of depricable amount of an asset over its useful life specified in Port C. Depreciation on additions during the year is provided on pro-rate basis with reference to the date of addition and period of use.

2 08 Revenue recognition

Sales are recognised, net of returns and trade discounts, on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer, which generally coincides with the delivery of goods to customers. Sales exclude sales tax and value added tax.

2.09 Other income

Interest income from a financial asset is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of income can be measured reliably. Interest income is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount on initial recognition.

2 10 Foreign currency transactions and translations

Initial recognition

The company have transations in foreign currencies during the year.

Government subsidies

The Company was eligible for 5% Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme, Interest Subsidy.

The Company has not made any investment.

2.13 Employee benefits

2 14 Carnings per share

Difuted earnings per share in computed by dividing the profit / (lose) after the rectuding the post fax effect of extraordinary items, if any) as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income relating to the deliver potential equity shares by the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all difutive potential equity shares. Potential equity shares are deemed to be difutive only if their conversion to equity shares would decrease the net profit per share from continuing ordinary operations. Potential dilutive equity shares are deemed to be converted as at the beginning of the period, unless they have been issued at a later test.

2.15 Taxes on Income

Current lax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the income Tax

Minimum Atternate Tax (MAT) paid in accordance with the tax laws, which gives future economic benefits in the form of adjustment to future income tax trability, is considered as an asset if there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax. Accordingly, MAT is recognised as an asset in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefit associated with it will flow to the Company.

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets in respect of unar date depreciation and carry forward of losses are recognised only if there is virtual certainty that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realise such assets. Deferred tax assets are recognised for timing differences of other items only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which these can be realised. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date for their realisability.

We draw attention that company has not follow the accounting Standard 22"Accounting for Tax on Income" The Company maintain the deferred tax asset of Rs 2.03,19,855/- Since the compnay incur losses and uncertainty of future profit.

2.16 impairment of assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generaling units at each Balance Sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognised, if the carrying amount of these assets exceeds their recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor. When there is indication that an impairment loss recognised for an asset in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss, except in case of revalued assets.

2.17 Provisions and contingencies

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.
